- b. **Tourist Destination:** May have a shorter-term focus on profit and attracting visitors without a primary emphasis on long-term sustainability.

9. Regulations and Certifications:

- a. **Sustainable Destination:** Often adheres to eco-certifications and sustainable tourism guidelines, such as Green Destination and Control Union, EarthCheck and Green Globe etc.
- b. **Tourist Destination:** May or may not have specific certifications related to sustainability.
